

## POSTDOCTORAL POSITIONS AT THE MAGIC TELESCOPE SITE

The MAGIC collaboration (http://magic.mppmu.mpg.de/) invites applications for **one postdoctoral position** in the field of ground-based GeV-TeV  $\gamma$ -ray Astrophysics.

The successful candidate will join the team that works at the MAGIC telescope site at the Roque de los Muchachos Observatory in the island of La Palma (Canary Islands, Spain). Her/his main technical duty will be the maintenance of the different subsystems of the MAGIC telescopes (photomultiplier cameras, mirrors, active mirror control and readout electronics) in close collaboration with the subsystem developers. She/he will also be expected to take part in the installation of any eventual new hardware elements at the site.

During a fraction of her/his time she/he will be free to do scientific research, which may include joining CTA. She/he will join the MAGIC collaboration as a full member, i.e. will be allowed to submit observation proposals, access all telescope data and publish results. A travel budget to join MAGIC meetings and attend scientific conferences will be at their disposal.

Applicants should hold a PhD degree in Physics or a related field, or alternatively a degree in Engineering, with focus on experimental developments. Experience in the field of detectors for high-energy physics or astrophysics is welcome, but not mandatory.

The position is available as early as January 1, 2017, and will stay open until it is filled. The contract is initially for two years, with possible extension depending on further funding of the project.

The MAGIC collaboration aims to increase the number of women in research and education: women are strongly encouraged to apply.

The applications should include a CV, list of publications, and names of two reference persons. All applications received before November 13th, 2016, will get full consideration. Please send your application indicating the key word "MAGIC Postdocs La Palma" to: Mrs. S. Strauch, sarastrauch@ifae.es
